Beloved children of God journeying toward the eternal kingdom;



Are you in a RUT? A rut of routine, of endlessness, a rut that has fleeting moments of instant gratification?

Many commented on my message on Ash Wednesday about the RUT. So I thought I would share this pneumonic for Lent again, to help us change our ruts into life giving practices.

**R = Rest = Prayer** practice dependency on God by regularly turning to Him, by speaking, listening, worshipping, scripture reading & being still.

Where can I set aside more time to hang out with God?

U = Unplug = Fast - to become more dependent on God & less dependent on those things that are taking over. What will I refrain from these 40 days?

T = Trust = Give - increasing my trust in God to provide by serving, by giving things that are hard for me to let go of, or providing for he needs of others around me.

What can I do, or share, to obey God and increase my faith?

<u>Get in a Godly Rut</u> = <u>REST</u> <u>UNPLUG</u> <u>TRUST</u>

Lent is a time to; Reflect, Repent, and Reconnect, in our communal 40 day observance which, parallels Jesus being led by the Spirit in the wilderness for 40 days.

As we offer ourselves back to God this Lent, I pray God shape us into the people God needs us to be for His sake.

A CARING CHURCH SHARING JESUS CHRIST WITH THE WORLD BY OFFERING HELP HOPE AND HOME Lent comes from a root word meaning *lengthen*, referring to the lengthening of days at springtime. Springtime is a time of rebirth and new life.

Jesus said a seed must fall into the ground and die to experience new life. Jesus bids us, deny yourself take up the cross and follow me. When we die to ourselves, we are emptied to make room for the Holy Spirit to surprise us with new life.

There at death's door we hear the surprising news that changes everything. *"Do not be afraid: I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here: for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, he has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee (home); there you will see him. This is my message for you."* Matthew 28:5-7

From the vantage point of adulthood, we may be surprised at what creates fear in a child, a vacuum cleaner, a seemingly harmless image, for me it was a big old parked tractor peering at me through a pain of glass in the garage door. Older siblings and trusted parents could come to us, stand with us, maybe hold a hand, and try to teach that we didn't have to be afraid. Slowly the child's tightened grip of fear is released as they come to trust the word of loved ones. As we grow and mature, we discover new fears that we will wrestle with. Who will come, hold our hand and teach? As we hear the story of God's ongoing, faithful relationship with his people throughout history, we hear of God coming to his children and repeatedly saying "Do not be afraid!" From his Divine vantage point God sees with greater wisdom that we need not be afraid of the things of this world that frightens us. This is why God has come to us to make himself known in Jesus Christ, to take away our fear, that we might come to know and trust God's love above all else.

In our Easter story, the angels, like older siblings, have the calm in knowing and the joy of sharing the good news, *Jesus is not dead but has risen*. Then comes the warm invitation come and see, then, go and tell. This is the invitation to us as well who have been met with God's surprises, responded to his word of truth, and have grown in the faith with the same commission to go and tell.

When I was a toddler my brother, who was three years older than I, seemed old, wise, and knew many of the secrets of the universe I had yet to discover. He would come and invite me to new adventures, which overwhelmed and intimidated me. He would walk with me, go first to show me the way, and demonstrate that there was nothing to fear. Soon new experiences would unfold before me, and the fear would dissipate.

He has taught us, God loves us and will never abandon us. He has overcome the obstacles of anything that might separate us from God (sin). He has gone first, ahead of you, through the grave and gate of death, to show us the way, and demonstrate there is nothing to fear. The Kingdom of God is ours forever!

Christ has risen from the dead, and <u>indeed He is going ahead of you</u> to Galilee; Galilee was the place of daily living, for the first disciples. We need to remember too, God will meet us in our place of daily living, in our homes, workplaces, schools, and in the people who cross our path each day. At Christmas we proclaim, God is with us. At Easter we proclaim God is ahead of us to meet us, just like he told us.

May the Holy Spirit give us the strength to let go, and guide us to **Rest**, **Unplug**, and **Trust** 

so we may be led to the green pastures, the still waters, and the new life ahead that God has prepared for us.

In Christ Jesus new experiences will unfold before us, and the fear will dissipate. We no longer need to live in fear, protecting ourselves at all costs, trying to preserve our decaying life. Because of the resurrection of Jesus we can live confidently in the truth Jesus brings us.

Today we can live a new life, of faith, for our greatest days are ahead of us...

"there you will see him. This is my message for you."


